



Peel Hall Primary School Sports Premium Grant 2017/2018

What is Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14, 2014/15, 2015/16 2016/17 to provide primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Objectives of Sport Premium Spending

The purpose of the Sports Premium is to fund improvements to the provision of Physical Education (P.E.) and sport for primary-aged pupils so that they develop healthy lifestyles.
