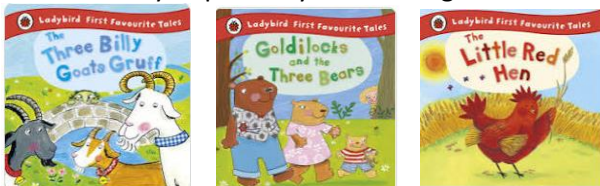

Nursery – Traditional tales

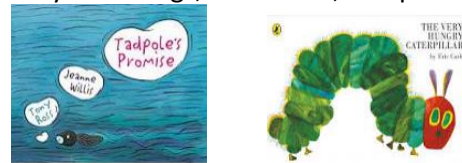
The topic for the first half of the Summer term in the Nursery is 'Traditional tales.' We will listen to lots of tales that you probably read during at school.



The children will have lots of time and opportunity to learn the repeated language within the stories, develop their understanding of characters and the story's setting, and start to learn the sequence of story and identify the beginning, the middle, and the end. The children will be involved in lots of writing activities too.

Reception – Lifecycles

The Reception topic for the first part of the Summer term is 'Lifecycles.' The children will investigate the lifecycle of frogs, butterflies, and plants.



The children will have lots of opportunities to learn about this topic through non-fiction books, and with have lots of hands on experiences too. Please bring your child's reading book into school everyday. Reading books will be kept in school on a Thursday as they get changed and given back out on a Friday.

Clothing in School

In the Early Years we endeavour every day to ensure that the children go home with all their belongings. We are now entering (hopefully) the warmer months of the year.
