English

After writing some great instructions before Easter, Year 3 are now writing traditional Greek fables.

During English last half term, Year 4 wrote letters inspired by Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. This half term we continue with the Roald Dahl theme as we are studying The Witches.

Maths

Prior to the break, Year 3 had a busy time learning fractions and money, then measuring length and perimeter. As we move into summer, they are still measuring, but with a focus on mass and capacity. They will also cover shape and time.

Last half term, Year 4 focused on Fractions and Decimals. We have explored tenths and hundredths in multiples ways. This half term, we are continuing with Decimals and also learning about Money and Time.

History/Geography

Our history topic in Year 3 is now the Ancient Greeks. We will learn how they lived and how their lives compare to the Ancient Egyptians... and to today!

Year 4 enjoyed learning about the Anglo-Saxons last half term. We switch to Geography for the next half term with our topic of Fairtrade. We will learn about what Fairtrade is and how it links to climate.

Science

Year 3 have moved on from forces and are now learning all about plants.

They will be looking at the differences and similarities between a range of plants.

Our topic in Year 4 this half term is Living things and their Habitats. We have looked at classifying animals and have explored the different habitats in our school environment.
